

It was a great summer of fellowship and making needed repairs for those who were temporarily unable to address those needs themselves. I am not complaining because the food, fellowship, and schedule were all great. 



In July, contributions were up but we also had some unexpected expenses. Year to date in 2017 our expenses were \$214,151 while our income from contributions was \$189,281 eaving a shortfall of \$24.870 so far this year.

There is now a program available with Meals on Wheels through Interfaith Ministries for our area. They will provide meals Monday through Friday once a week if you qualify, plus meals on the weekend if you pass the income test. There is no income test for meals Monday through Friday, but you must be 60 or above and be house bound. There will not be a meal provided for a caregiver, and if a caregiver is present prior to noon, you may not qualify. That organization can also refer you for pet food assistance if needed.

To enroll you need to contact Interfaith Ministries at 713-533-4900 and ask for Rosa Reyes, or call Rosa directly at 713-533-4978, so she can do an intake interview. Information needed is full name, home address, telephone number, and birth date.
